
## **WINTER 2020**

Now we find ourselves back in Stage 3 restrictions we have been required to close our Cellardoor again for tastings. We are still permitted to sell takeaway bottles for those fortunate enough to be able to come to us. Our online store on our website is also OPEN and we are paying for your freight charges if you order 12 bottles or multiples of 12 bottles (excluding cleanskins). We hope that you will be able to continue to enjoy our wines with your delicious meals in your own home, via these two sales channels. We have our own 'pfamily pfavourite pfoods' and as Jen said to me many years ago, "it is very therapeutic chopping up your own vegetables". So I am about to make one of our 'pfamily pfavourite's', Jen's 'pfamous' tomato pasta sauce and Jen IS right, it is very therapeutic, chop, chop, chopping.

So while that is simmering away, I thought I would fill you in on what has been happening here at Pfeiffer Wines. When you received my last letter we had just closed our Cellardoor which was really hard seeing we had been open for 35 years. However, we made the most of our time, doing lots of jobs we couldn't do while we had visitors to the winery and one of those jobs was painting our tasting counter bright white again. When Chris and I first bought the winery and chose to build the Cellardoor tasting room in the most historic and beautiful part of the complex of buildings, Chris decided a white counter top would be best to see the colours of the wines. Great idea, except when the red wines were accidentally dripped onto the pristine white surface! I became a constant "wiper upperer" and loved it when those magic sponges were invented to remove stains. Our pews have all been restained and our gardens have been tidied up. Jean has cleaned up and re-organised the warehouse. Jen and her winery team have been busy with the preparations required to bottle the 2019 reds (plus many of the other jobs that happen in the winery at this time of year) and Mick and his team in the vineyard have been pruning, pruning, pruning.

In the Cellardoor the team have worked hard to create lots of interesting online packs that have included products from some of our local market regulars including Warby Wood and Pasta Adele.

We are constantly thinking of as many ways as we can to keep in touch with you. Jen and Chris's Shiraz Masterclass on Zoom was well received a few weeks ago and our online Muscat Master Blender Experience has proved to be a huge success and very popular...and can still be booked if you are interested. Please keep a regular eye out in the SPECIAL OFFERS section of our Online Store for all of the ideas we are coming up with as it changes regularly.

We have also been thinking outside the square with our annual capital city lunches. Our Melbourne long and lazy Sunday Lunch to be held this year at Marameo in Russell Street, was still catered by Marameo... but with a twist...with them delivering the meal to enjoy in your own home!!
